The meaning of Permit to Work



Understanding

A **Permit to Work** is mandatory for the tasks specified in sites and jobs carried out in hazardous areas and high-risk jobs.



Target

The procedure is used to ensure the health and safety of all employees, including administrative, technical, and operational personnel.



Application

A **Permit to Work** must be issued for each specific work site and for the particular duration of the work.



Primary Permit to Work types

Hazardous work/construction work

Inherently high-risk jobs (e.g., work in excavations, confined spaces, protective zones for electricity or gas, work near roads or rail, at height, various lifting operations, fire or explosion hazard).

Work with thermal processing equipment

Work performed with heat equipment or in its impact zone (e.g., emergency procedures, process optimization, maintenance, and repairs).

Work with electrical equipment

Work that requires the qualifications of a certified electrical engineering worker (e.g., installation and commissioning, routine maintenance, repairs).

Hot work operations

Jobs during which heat is used or generated (e.g., welding, cutting, grinding, and work involving open flames).

Work in confined spaces

Areas in the workplace, specifically the part of the space directly surrounding the worker (e.g., tanks, pipelines, silos, pits).

Hot work operations



The General Fire Safety Rules, approved by the Director of the Fire and Rescue Department under the Ministry of the Interior on February 18, 2005, by order No. 64.

Work with electrical equipment



The Safety Rules for Operating Electrical Equipment, approved by the Minister of Energy of the Republic of Lithuania on March 30, 2010, by order No. 1-100.

Work in confined spaces



The Safety Rules for Work in Environments of Natural Gas, Liquefied Petroleum Gas, and Biogas, approved by the Minister of Energy of the Republic of Lithuania on September 28, 2012, by order No. 1-191.

Work with thermal processing equipment



Safety Rules for Operating Heat Equipment, approved by the Minister of Energy of the Republic of Lithuania on September 13, 2016, by order No. 1-246.

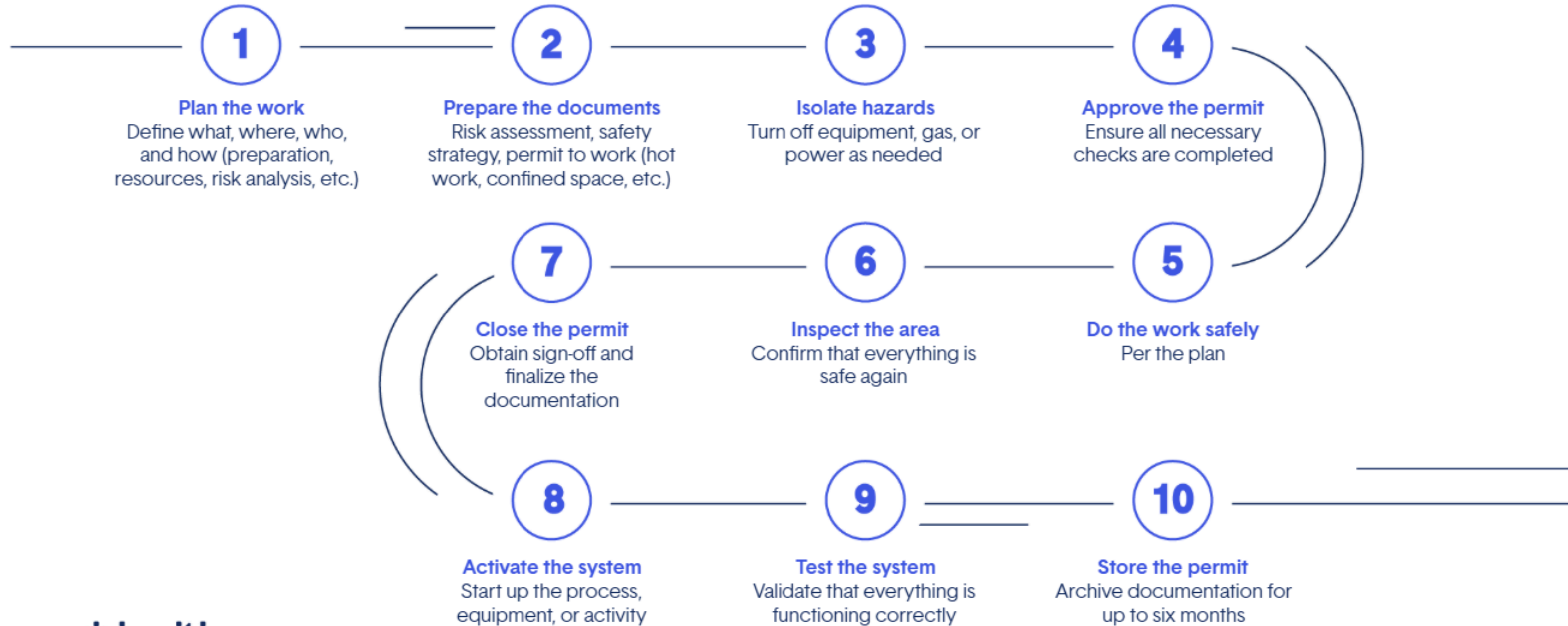
Permit to work



The recommendations prepared by the National Labour Inspectorate include minimum safety and health requirements for organizing and performing construction work and the recommended procedure for issuing assignments and permits.

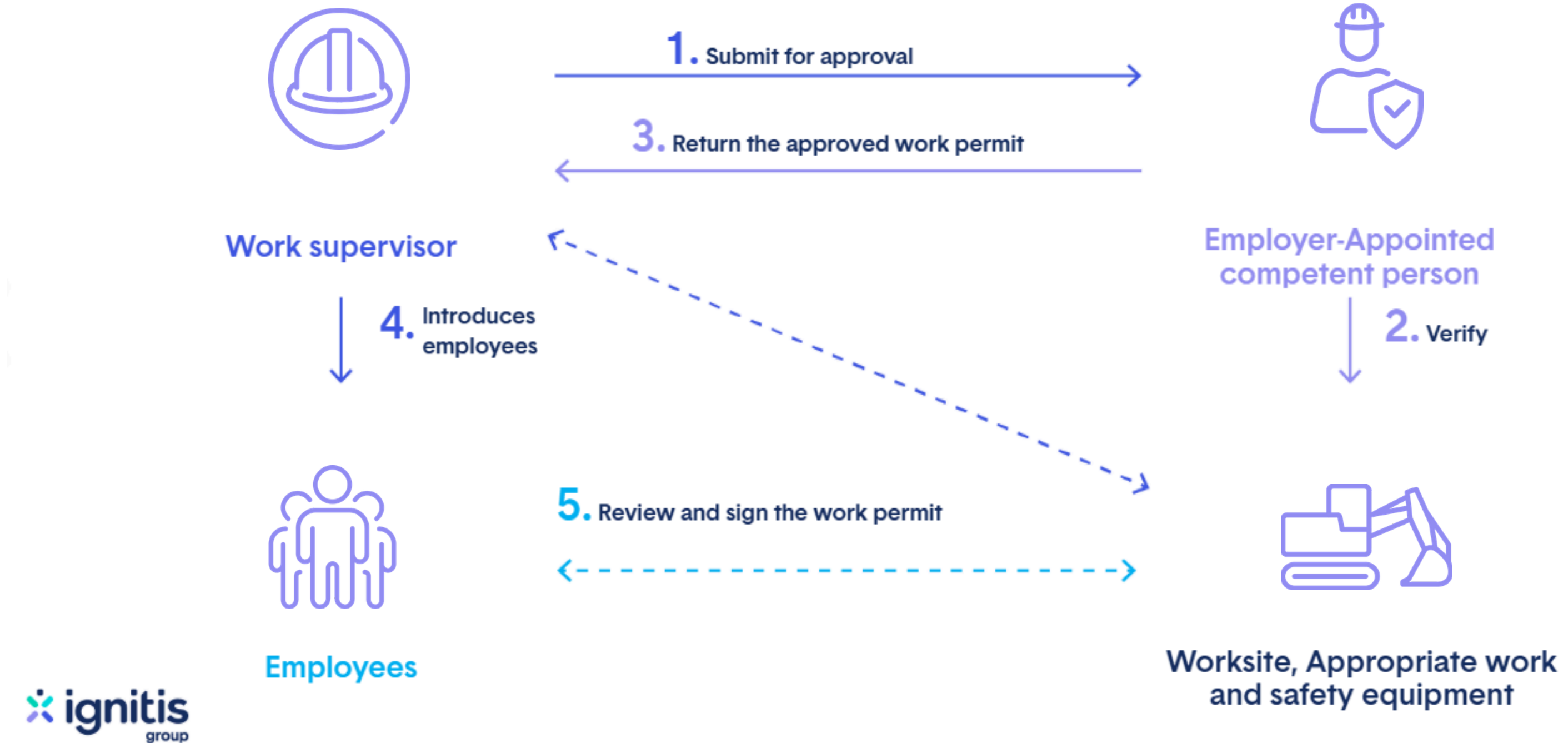
